## About the Work

### 'Imagine this country, again'

A new major work for Australian Dance Theatre, conceived and directed by Artistic Director, Daniel Riley, Marrow sees the company existing on the threshold of our past and present. A choreographic course correction for a Nation in need of a new direction.

Wrestling with the layers of our history, our extraordinary artists will dive into the smoky forms of our national conscience to imagine a shared ground where politics and identity are inherent but not our totality.

First time collaborator Uncle Moogy Sumner, Kaurna/ Ngarrindjeri Elder joins previous ADT collaborators Matthew Adev (The Hum), James Howard (Savage) and Ailsa Patterson (Tracker) to create an intimate world in which physical, spiritual, and historical inheritance are unpacked.

Confined to a eight-by-eight metre performance space, six dancers are joined in the world of Marrow by a seventh 'character', sculpted from smoke. They peel and dive beneath multiple layers of materials on stage, manipulating these to represent our relationships with the many layers of our history.

Burrowing into the same world of power and identity as our acclaimed 2022 production SAVAGE, Marrow suggests a future that acknowledges the weight of our history and push of our present.
